LAWS OF LIFE ESSAY CONTEST

Last spring, Dawn Balog's OGT juniors and seniors were asked to participate in an essay contest sponsored by the Better Business Bureau and the Ohio Partners in Character Education (OPCE) organization entitled, "Laws of Life." This contest focused on challenging students to reflect on, and express in their own words, the ideals and principles that guide them through life. The goal was to meet state wide writing standards and provide practice for standardized tests or college entrance essays. Judging focused more on the thought process and self-awareness of the writer and less on the writing ability.

Dawn was permitted to submit one essay from her class. The essay was written by Jasmine Reyes of Wellington, from the OAA II program. The more essays written, the more entries allowed for this particular contest.

The award ceremony took place in Columbus on Wednesday, October 26, 2011. More than \$5,000 in prizes were awarded to winning students in grades 6-12, along with their teachers/ essay coordinators. Jasmine was awarded a \$50 check and Dawn Balog received \$75 for submitting one of the "Superior" essays.
