SUMMER YOUTH INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

The Summer Youth Internship Program is an opportunity available to Lorain County JVS juniors who have successfully completed their first year of career-technical training, and who have superior attendance and strong teacher recommendations. This experience extends student learning beyond the classroom and provides students with real world work experience. Students also have the opportunity to interact with company employees and mentors, and develop a direct pathway to additional education and training or future employment.

This year 75 students from 20 different career-technical programs successfully completed the Summer Youth Internship Program. These students were employed by 62 different employers. In total, the students earned over \$160,000 over the summer!
